### Instructions

- Dogs must be able to sequence at least 6 obstacles.
- Handler must be a current member of Contact Zonies.
- **Classes start at 6:30pm and end at 8:30pm. Please do not sign up if you cannot be ready to start at 6:30pm and/or stay until 8:30pm.**
- Each class is limited to 6 students. If more than 6 entries are received by the entry deadline date, a random draw will be held to select students for that class.
- Early registration is suggested. If a class fills, a random draw will be held, and a wait list will be created.

- If registering more than one dog, use a separate form for each dog.

All participants and instructors must follow CDC guidelines. Masks are required and everyone must practice physical distancing of at least six feet. Only one handler/dog team is allowed on the field at a time.

<b>Stays and Sends</b>	Sept 23 Week 1	Sept 16	Start line stays, lead outs, and other ways to get up that line. We will work various options and give you some tools for your toolkit	
<b>Find Your Feet</b>	Sept 30 Week 2	Sept 23	Did your dog go in an unexpected direction? Might be your feet! We'll discuss the hierarchy of what the dog 'reads' from your handling and address the sometimes unintentional messages your feet send	
<b>Clarifying Crosses</b>	Oct 7 Week 3	Sept 30	So many crosses! Front cross, rear cross, blind cross – plus reverse spins, backside sends, etc. What works best and where? Refine your motion to sharpen your dog's response	
<b>Where's the Line?</b>	Oct 14 Week 4	Oct 7	What's the best line for your dog? Where's the best line for you? We'll work to identify the lines and then put them into practice	
<b>Cue That! (timing)</b>	Oct 21 Week 5	Oct 14	What's the right time to start and finish your cue sequence? What is a cue sequence? Come and work on making your dog SO HAPPY with clear and timely handling	
<b>Spotting Serpentes (&amp; Threadles)</b>	Oct 28 Week 6	Oct 21	We typically think of serps and threadles as being a straight line of jumps. But these patterns aren't always so straight-forward. Learn to spot those 'hiding' patterns on the course

<b>Out of the Box (180s &amp; 270s)</b>	Nov 4 Week 7	Oct 28	We'll break out the Hobday box and work those corners, then take those skills out onto the larger course	
<b>Ready, Steady, Trial!</b>	Nov 11 Week 8	Nov 4	What do you need to start trialing? Where do you begin? We'll talk about the different venues, the paperwork, what you can expect your first day at a trial, and what prep your dog may need to get your team into the ring. No dogs for this one. Bring a comfortable chair	
<b>Get Your Gamble On</b>	Nov 18 Week 9	Nov 11	Are you ready for gamblers? Work on the skills needed to complete the gamble. We will have several 'just the gamble' setups and will work on building your team's confidence	
<b>*SUBMIT a separate check for EACH class you are entering.</b> If there is a draw for your class and you do NOT get in, you will be contacted and asked if you want the check shredded or returned.

**Refunds:** Skills course fees will ONLY be refunded if there is someone on from a draw list who can attend. Students must contact Mark W. no later than the Friday before the class date to request a refund. A 100% refund will be given with proof from a veterinarian that the dog is injured and unable to participate.

**RULES:**

1. All participants and instructors must follow CDC guidelines. Masks are required and everyone must practice social distancing. Only one handler is allowed on the field during class to limit the number of people.
2. Dogs must be able to perform a minimum of six (6) obstacles consecutively.
3. All class participants must be current members of Contact Zonies.
4. Participant attests that the rabies vaccination/titer date provided is accurate and current in accordance with Maricopa County Animal Care and Control.
5. Participants are expected to assist in the set-up and/or tear down of equipment for class. Let your instructor know if you have mobility or lifting restrictions - safety first! Class time is 75 minutes and includes 15 minutes for setup and/or tear down of equipment.
6. Classes are taught by volunteer club members and are not paid professional instructors; all instructors are qualified to teach their class level.
7. Class lessons follow a written curriculum that is carefully designed to provide a safe, cohesive, consistent and progressive approach to training all of the agility obstacles and handling maneuvers.
8. Contact Zonies' training philosophy is based on a positive reinforcement methodology. No force or coercion is used in our training approach. Food, toy play and praise are the primary reinforcers employed to creating a positive learning environment for both the dog and handler.
9. Participants are not allowed to use e-collars at any time while on the training field. Prong collars and gentle leaders are allowed but must be removed when the dog is doing an exercise.
10. Participants must be able to recall their dogs in a safe and timely manner.
